


Art Entry 1 - Aariz


Aariz wishes Ramadan Kareem to everyone in the ummah.






Art Entry 3 - Dana




Age: 5 years old




Art Entry 6- Fatima




Art Entry 11 - Malak


Art Entry 13 - Mariem



Age: 14 years old.








Art Entry 22 - Yasir
